About Child Witness Centre

Did you know 27% of Canadians report experiencing physical or sexual abuse before the age of 15? At Child Witness Centre, we believe every hurt and harmed young person should be helped through the criminal justice system. That is why we walk with child and youth victims, and their families, from the time of investigation, through to a court resolution. We offer a safe landing place, listening ear, and education. We also provide testimonial support and attend court with them.

This past year alone, we supported 1,006 young clients in Waterloo Region, Guelph, and Wellington County. Sadly, this did not meet the need as we are working to overcome a waitlist for first time since we began in 1981. For those we support, their healing begins, trauma is reduced, and futures become brighter.

Role Overview

Our volunteer Board of Directors are vital towards our success in making a difference in our community. At this time, those with social work or lived victim service experience would be a tremendous asset to grow our quality of care and responsiveness, both internally and externally. As a small nonprofit organization, each member plays a key role towards the overall health, strength, and effectiveness of our agency – including financially. We estimate a time commitment of 8 to 10 hours per month for each Board Member.

Specific Responsibilities

- Regularly attend and participate in Board meetings: 10 per year, in addition to the AGM. Meetings are generally one to two hours in length. Board meetings are currently held on the first Monday of the month.
- Participate in at least one Board committee, which currently include: Finance, Audit and Investment; Governance; and Human Resources/Nominations.
- Support our fundraising efforts and agency events as well as make an annual donation to our agency.
- Provide special assistance as requested by our Executive Director. Requests are generally based on the subject matter and expertise of the board member (i.e., policing, legal, fundraising, etc.)
- Participate in an ad hoc committee as needed.
